Our diamond in the rough is Dolphin Park, currently undergoing renovations of buildings and evaluating its recreational possibilities. ## From the Township Manager's Desk

## LAWN & YARD BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES



### **Vegetation Quick Tips**

- Plant native vegetation. It will withstand drought conditions and require less watering.
- Start a compost pile! Composting recycles yard waste, reduces trash and results in great soil for your garden. www.howtocompost.org
- Test your soil to determine fertilizer needed. Standard soil test kits may be purchased from Penn State Extension Bucks County Office. Call 267-483-2020 or email BucksExt@psu.edu.
- If you do need to fertilize your lawn, never apply more than is recommended too much can burn your lawn. Do not fertilize before a rain storm.

### **Water Quick Tips**

- Use mulch around plants & trees to reduce water evaporation from the soil, but never cover the base of a tree trunk.
- Keep storm drains free of debris & vegetation.

### **Rain Barrels**

A rain barrel is system that collects & stores rainwater from your roof to be used for irrigating gardens and lawns, while conserving water.

### What are the Advantages of a Rain Barrel?

Lawn & garden watering make up nearly 40% of total household water use during the summer. A rain barrel collects water and stores it for when you need it most to water plants, wash your car, or to top of a swimming pool. Be sure to prevent mosquitoes by screening any openings.

A rain barrel will save most homeowners about 1,300 gallons of water during the peak summer months. Diverting water from storm drains also decreases the impact of runoff to streams.



### **Rain Gardens**

A rain garden is a slightly graded area in the landscape that collects rain water from a roof, driveway or street and allows it to soak into the ground. Benefits from a rain garden include beautifying your yard, reducing stormwater runoff, and reduce the risk of flooding & drainage.



### Other Helpful Tips:

- Stop or reduce use of pesticides and herbicides.
- Wash your car at a facility that captures and reuses its wash water. If you
  wash your car at home, do it in the grass.
- Repair car leaks. Oil and other substances are carried to the stream by rain.
- Keep gutters and downspouts clean. Clogged gutters can harbor mosquitoes.
- Raise your mower height to at least 3 inches for a healthier lawn that will slow down and reduce runoff.

# Surviving a POWER OUTAGE

power outage is when the electrical power goes out unexpectedly. Extended power outages may impact the whole community and the economy.

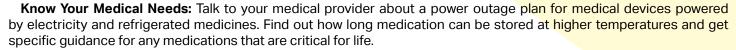
A power outage may:

- Disrupt communications, water and transportation.
- Close retail businesses, grocery stores, gas stations, ATMs, banks and other services.
- Cause food spoilage and water contamination.
- · Prevent use of medical devices.

How to Protect Yourself During A Power Outage: Go to a community location with power if heat or cold is extreme.

Preparing for a Power Outage: Take an inventory of the items you need that rely on electricity. Plan for batteries and other alternative power sources to meet your needs

when the power goes out, such as a portable charger or power bank. Have flashlights for every household member. Determine whether your home phone will work in a power outage and how long battery backup will last.



Food Storage: Have enough nonperishable food and water. Keep freezers and refrigerators closed. The refrigerator will keep food cold for about four hours. A full freezer will keep the temperature for about 48 hours. Use coolers with ice if necessary. Monitor temperatures with a thermometer. Throw out food if the temperature is 40 degrees or higher.

Using Appliances During Power Outages: Install carbon monoxide detectors with battery backup in central locations on every level of your home. Avoid carbon monoxide poisoning. Generators, camp stoves or charcoal grills should a<mark>lways</mark> be used outdoors and at least 20 feet away from windows. Never use a gas stove top or oven to heat your home. Turn off or disconnect appliances, equipment, or electronics. Power may return with momentary surges or spikes that can cause damage.

### **Returning After A Power Outage**

- When in doubt, throw it out! Throw away any food that has been exposed to temperatures 40 degrees or higher for two hours or more, or that has an unusual odor, color or texture.
- If the power is out for more than a day, discard any medication that should be refrigerated, unless the drug's label says otherwise. Consult your doctor or pharmacist immediately for a new supply.

## LEAF AND YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Leaf and yard waste collection will resume on Thursday, April 6th. Residents should only use biodegradable, 30 gallon paper bags or trash containers that do not weigh more than 50 pounds when full. Yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected. Tree branches and shrubbery must be no more than 36 inches long and less than 3 inches in diameter. They must be bundled and tied, taped or put in biodegradable bags. Branches or shrubbery cannot extend over the top of the can or bag.



### SANITATION REBATES FOR SENIORS & DISABLED VETERANS

The Sanitation/Trash Rebates for the 2022 tax year will be given to qualifying residents beginning February 8, 2023 thru May 31, 2023. The rebate is \$50 per household. To qualify for this rebate, a resident must meet the following criteria:

- Must be a Lower Southampton Township resident.
- Must be a Senior Citizen age 65 years or older.
- A Veteran that is 50% disabled or greater with a letter stating % of disability.
- Must be the homeowner for the entire year of 2022. No rebates will be given if not the owner from January 1 through December 31

There is only one rebate per household. Rebates will be given for primary residence only (must match with the address on your driver's license). You must present an ID showing you are 65 years or older. Must be 65 by 12/31/22. To receive your rebate, stop by the Township Administration Building or call Denise at 215-357-7300 x312.



## **Property Maintenance Code**

- The exterior of a structure shall be maintained in good repair, structurally sound and sanitary, and not pose a threat to the public health, safety or welfare.
- Owners of property situated in the Township of Lower Southampton, whether such property is occupied or vacant, must keep the property reasonably free of weeds, bamboo, underbrush, cans, bottles or any other refuse or debris which may create or may tend to create a harbor for rats or other hazard to the public health and safety of others. Owners of all such property must keep the grass cut on their premises, including the grass in the sidewalk areas adjoining their premises.



- All premises and exterior property shall be free from weeds or plant growth in excess of 6 inches. Weeds shall be
  defined as all grasses, annual plants and vegetation, other than trees or shrubs; however, this shall not include
  cultivated flowers and gardens.
- All fences, retaining walls or similar structures shall be constructed properly and maintained.
- All accessory structures, including detached garages, sheds, cabanas and swimming pools shall be maintained in structurally sound conditions and in overall good repair.
- Each structure to which a street number has been assigned shall have such number displayed so that it can be easily
  observed and readable from the public right-of-way.
- Each dwelling must have at least one smoke detector on each floor and a minimum a smoke detector in each bedroom.
   Smoke detectors should be inter-connected. Smoke detectors save lives. Contact the Fire Marshal Office if you are in need of smoke detectors.

### **Property Owner Responsibilities**

As a property owner, you have certain obligations. Protect your investments and health of the occupants by maintaining your property properly.

- 1. Do all repairs in an approved manner, using proper materials in accordance with all applicable codes.
- 2. Keep the exterior of the structure free of broken glass, loose roofing and siding shingles, peeling paint and crumbling stone or bricks.
- 3. Maintain doors and windows, including storm doors and screens, in good working condition. Functional doors and windows may be critical in emergency situations.
- 4. Maintain driveways and walkways in proper states of repair, free of hazardous conditions.
- 5. Maintain property free of rodents and parasites.
- Keep all yards or lots free of unsightly materials, debris, and junk materials which may cause fire hazards or may act as breeding places for vermin and insects.
- 7. Properly dispose of garbage and rubbish in containers with lids. Don't place garbage or trash receptacles at the curb earlier than (1) day prior to scheduled pickup. All containers must be returned to their original storage place within (1) day after pickup.
- 8. Take care of pets. Don't allow pets to run free. Dogs must be leashed at all times when not on the premises of the owner or keeper. Clean up waste daily.
- Cut and trim all trees, weeds, hedges, shrubbery, and underbrush abutting on the streets or sidewalks. Provide at all times a clear passage of nine (9') feet above the sidewalks and eleven (11') feet above the street.
- 10. Properly maintain all vehicles. It is against the law to keep or store any vehicle on either a public street or on a private property which is not operable or which does not have a current license plate and/ or a current registration.

### **Tenant Responsibilities**

- Maintain dwelling in a clean and sanitary condition, free of conditions which might encourage rodent infestations.
- 2. Properly dispose of garbage and rubbish in containers with lids.
- Maintain yard in a neat and sanitary manner, free of litter, junk, abandoned/ unlicensed vehicles and animal waste.
- Notify owner when repairs are needed and allow reasonable time for owner to complete repairs before contacting township officials.

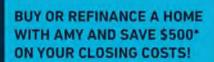

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## Fire Safety News

Spring is fast approaching! This is a perfect time to do a little spring cleaning and Fire Safety check indoors and out. It is important to keep your home clean to prevent a fire from occurring. Here are some tips for your spring cleaning routine:

### INDOOR CLEANING TIPS

- 1. Dust and dirt can quickly build up and become combustible. Be sure to vacuum & dust areas that can build up.
- 2. Clear clutter in hallways & stairways. Clutter provides fuel for fire to spread. It also blocks exits and escape routes in the case of an emergency.
- 3. Check Smoke Alarms & Carbon Monoxide Detectors.
- 4. Don't use electrical appliances or tools with frayed cords. Replace them immediately. Also check to make sure you do not have too many devices plugged into one outlet area.
- 5. Check for water around electrical appliances such as your washing machine, dryer, or dishwasher.
- 6. Check all appliances to make sure they are in good working condition. (stove, oven, toaster oven, microwave, toaster, coffee maker etc). If you notice any issues, replace or repair.
- 7. Clean dryer vent and lint trap. Lint is highly combustible and can cause a fire if it is not removed. Use a hose to remove excess lint buildup or blockage.

### **OUTDOOR CLEANING TIPS**

- 1. Trim trees or bushes that are close to your home. This creates a "defensible space" between your home and potential fire sources. If you have dead or dying trees, now is an excellent time to remove them. Dead vegetation is highly flammable.
- 2. Check gas grills for rust, worn parts, grease and other debris before use. Grilling is a popular spring and summer activity, but it is essential to ensure the grill is clean and operational before its first use of the season. Also check the propane tank for leaks.
- 3. Move the grill at least 10 ft. away from house before use. Clear area around the grill of debris or flammable materials.
- 4. Make sure your home address is visible from the street. If your address is too small orblocked for any reason, emergency responders will have difficulty finding your home in the event of an emergency. Make sure it is easy to read, and visible from the street.

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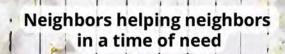
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
